Kansas State Specific Land Surveying Examination

As of October 2012, the state specific surveyor exam will be split into two parts. Per K.A.R. 66-8-4, passing this exam is required of each applicant applying for a Professional Surveying license in the state of Kansas. Both parts of the exam are open book.

Part I — GENERAL: (Multiple Choice)

You must have successful results on each part of the KSS to pass the exam. Per K.A.R. 66-8-6, any applicant who fails an examination on the first attempt may retake the examination two additional times without having to address the deficiencies on their performance with the Board.
